THE SCHOLARSHIP

Established in August of 2008, the Project Weather Scholarship will be awarded once each year to seven high school seniors who excel in science. The scholarship is granted as a part of Spectrum News 13's commitment to educating children about science and weather.

- ◆ Have earned a minimum grade point average (GPA) of 3.5 on a 4-point scale.
- ◆ Be a student in a public, private, home, or parochial school in grade 12 (or equivalent in their final year of high school) as of the date of entry.

GENERAL INFORMATION

The Project Weather Scholarship is a one-time award given to one student attending a public, private, home, or parochial school in each of the following counties: Brevard, Flagler, Lake, Marion, Orange, Osceola, Seminole, Sumter, and Volusia. Each Project Weather Scholarship Contest Winner will be awarded a \$1,000 check. Each recipient will also be recognized on Spectrum News 13 and on MyNews13.com.
