



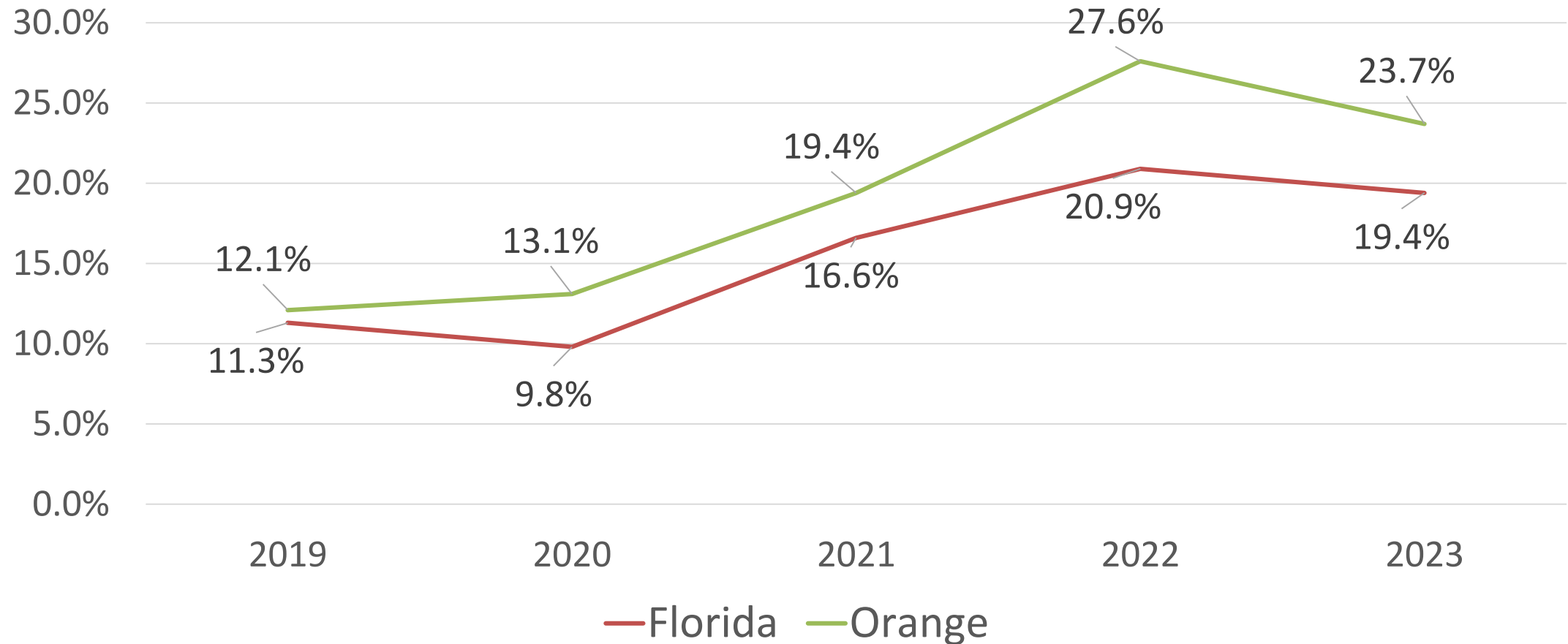

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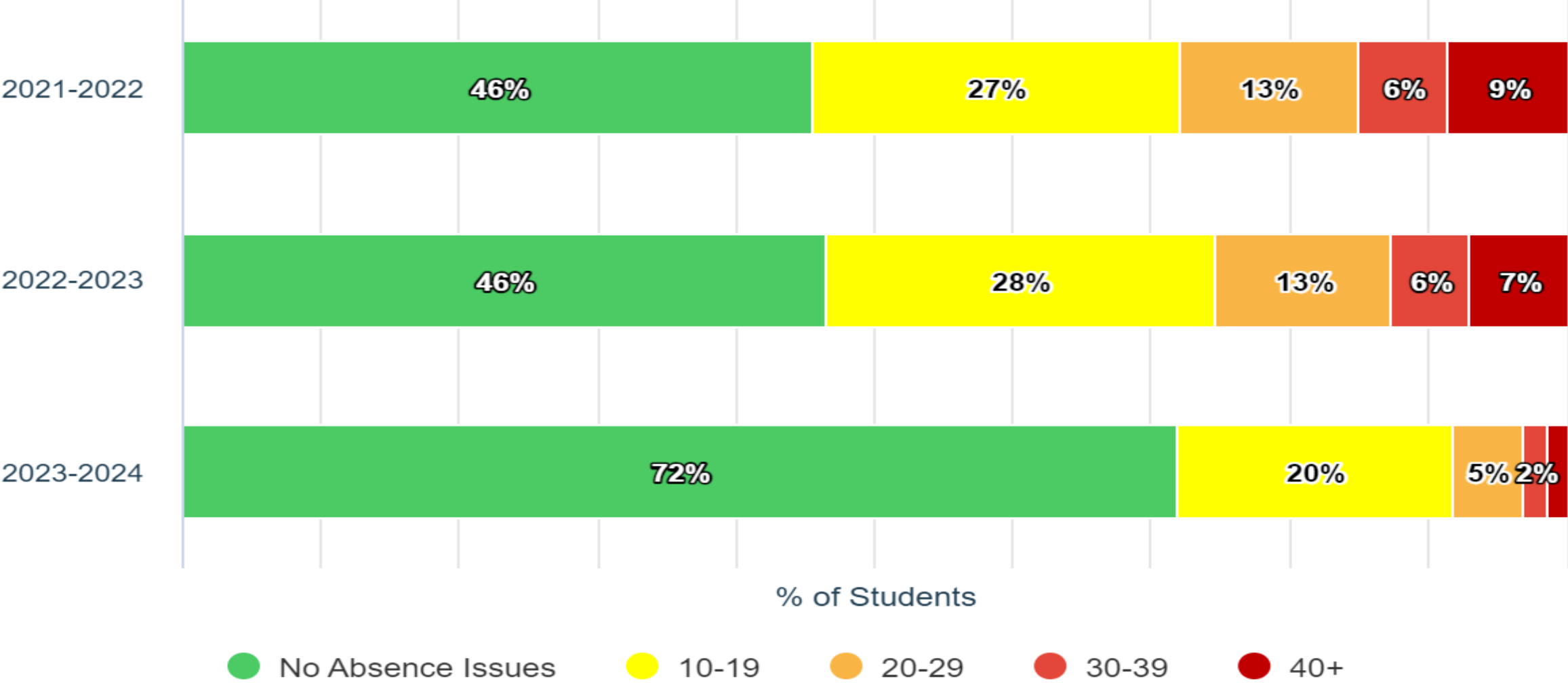

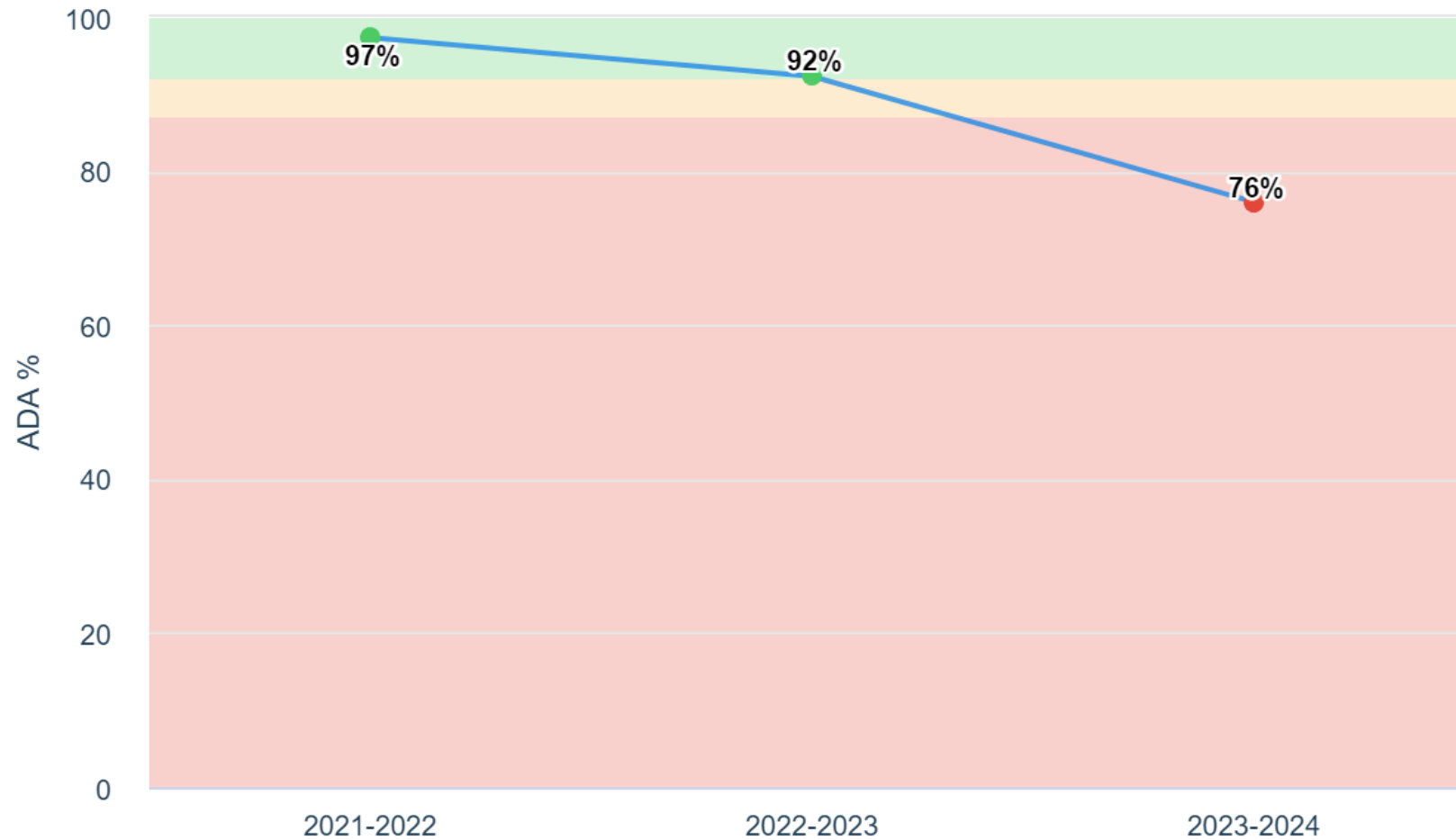


# Attendance Counts



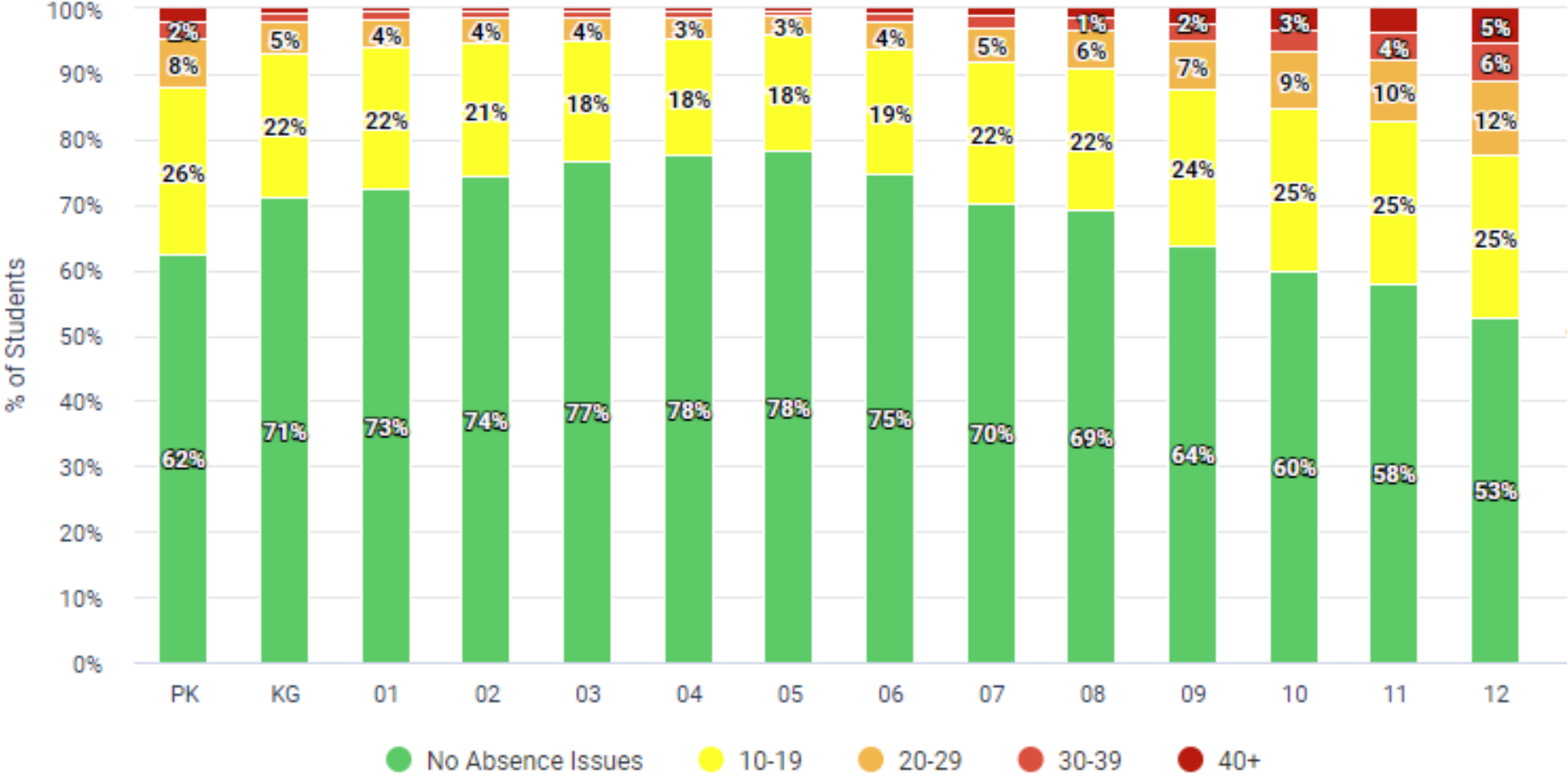
# Student Average Daily Attendance

# Additional Measures Taken

- Increasing communication with principal leaders and schools
- Increasing collaboration with social workers for attendance interventions
- Increasing communication and awareness with parents

# What is Working

- Increasing social worker and registrar (attendance clerk) collaboration
- Creating an environment where students want to be in school
- Reaching out to families if a student is absent two or more days
- Including attendance conversation during PLCs
- Building relationships with students
- Ensuring truancy letters are printed, signed and mailed out consistently
- Offering incentives for improved attendance
- Convening the Attendance Child Study Team
- Utilizing the Truancy Intervention Process Flow Chart
